Land

Its size and layout offer great flexibility for future projects. Highway 95 is the only N-S highway in western Idaho and is one of the most scenic routes in the West. US 95 runs from the Canadian border in the north to the Boise metropolitan area in the south. It passes through 13 counties and connects cities such as Lewiston, Coeur d'Alene, Sandpoint, and Bonners Ferry. US 95 was established in 1926 as one of the country's first national highways. The AADT (Annual Average Daily Traffic) for US Highway 95 near this site is 11,500.

Recreation

Lewiston, Idaho, offers a variety of recreational activities due to its location at the confluence of the Snake and Clearwater rivers and its proximity to diverse landscapes. Water-based activities like boating and fishing are popular on the rivers, especially during the warmer months. Region & Climate

Today, Lewiston is known for its outdoor recreation, proximity to Hells Canyon, and its role as a regional center for education, healthcare, and commerce.

Location

Lewiston, Idaho, is situated in the northwestern part of the state, near the Washington border, at the confluence of the Snake and Clearwater rivers. It lies in the Lewis-Clark Valley, surrounded by the rolling hills of the Palouse to the north and rugged mountainous terrain to the east.
